



Vision for OTC

NAVWAR Facilities

- · Located on 70 acres of Navy-owned land at OTC
- · Current facilities originally built in 1940 as an assembly plant for the B-24 bombers
- · 2018 Request for Interest issued to explore public-private development opportunities
- 2019 Secretary of the Navy signed an agreement with the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) to allow collaboration and cooperation for a potential redevelopment, with a follow-on agreement signed in January 2020

Looking Forward, the Navy Requires

- · Secure, safe, and modern facilities
- Support NAVWAR's requirements
- · Optimize use of Navy prime real estate property

End State

- · State-of-the-art facilities that are a hub for tech development
- Nation's premier center for cyber warfare

Notice of Intent January 24, 2020

Announced the Navy's intent to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

Public Scoping Period January 24 – February 24, 2020 Public process to determine the scope and issues to be considered for analysis in the EIS. The Navy held public scoping meetings on February 13 and 19, 2020.

Draft EIS

The Navy will collect and consider all comments received during the public scoping period and prepare the Draft EIS available early 2021.


