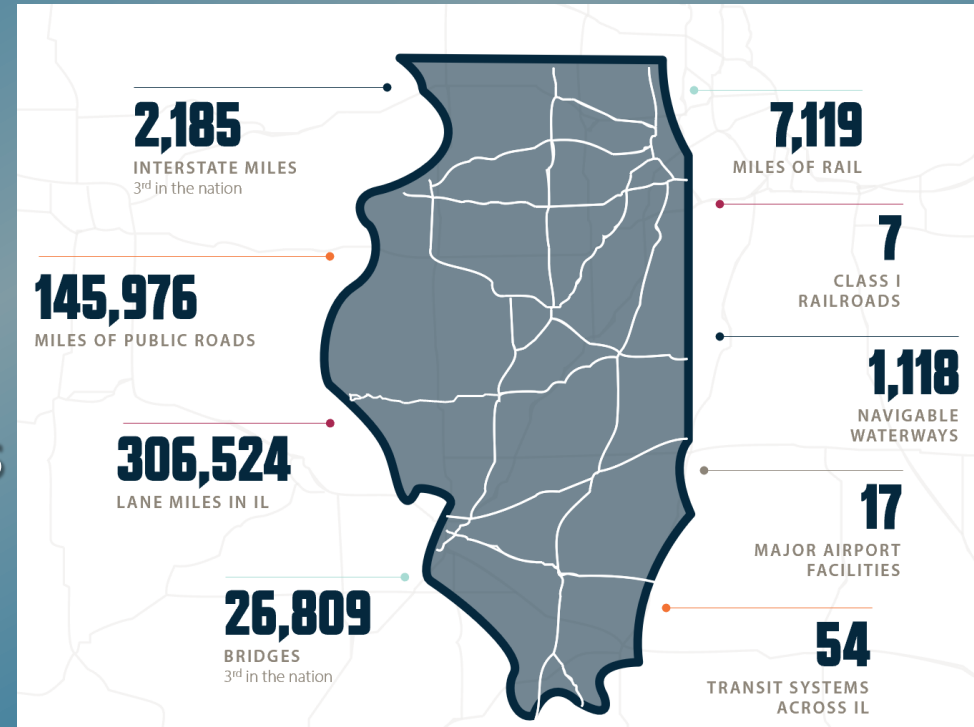

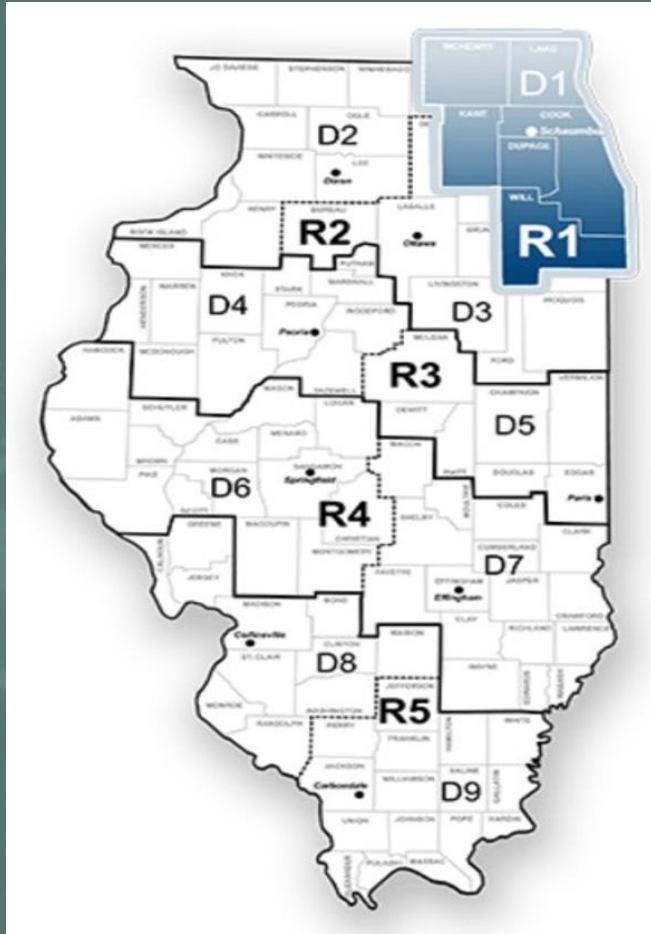

WHY REBUILD ILLINOIS?

Illinois is the transportation hub of the nation and the sixth-largest state in the United States but has not had a comprehensive capital plan since 2009. Illinois infrastructure is in dire shape.

- ❑ \$30 billion maintenance backlogs for our road and transit systems
- ❑ The state is in danger of losing federal funds due to historically insufficient funding commitments by the state and deteriorating System conditions
- ❑ Average motorist paying \$564 in repairs annually due to poor Infrastructure

Rebuild Illinois repairs our crumbling roads, bridges and transit.

- ❑ \$44.8 Billion invested over six years, with \$33.2 billion of that on transportation across all modes
- ❑ 540,000 Direct, indirect, and induced jobs, including almost 431,600 in transportation, supported over six years of Rebuild Illinois
- ❑ Provides necessary funding to secure federal dollars for transportation

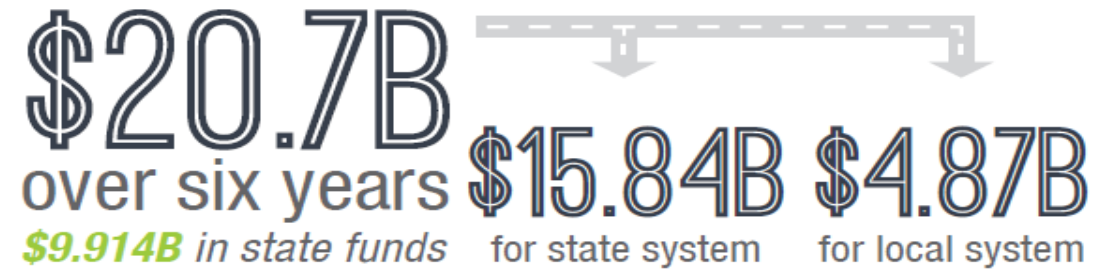

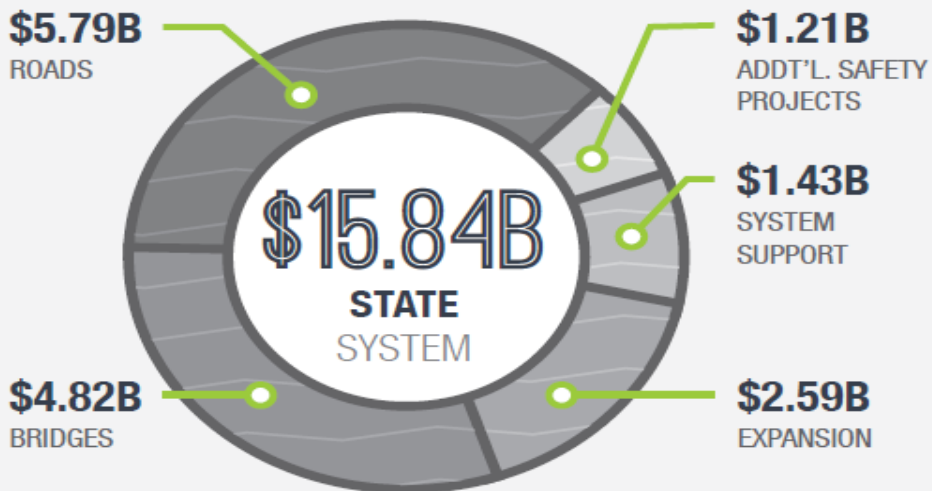
REBUILDING OUR MYP

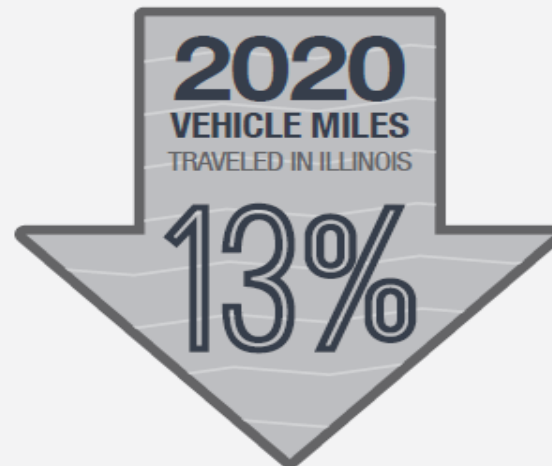

IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON MOTOR FUEL TAX REVENUES

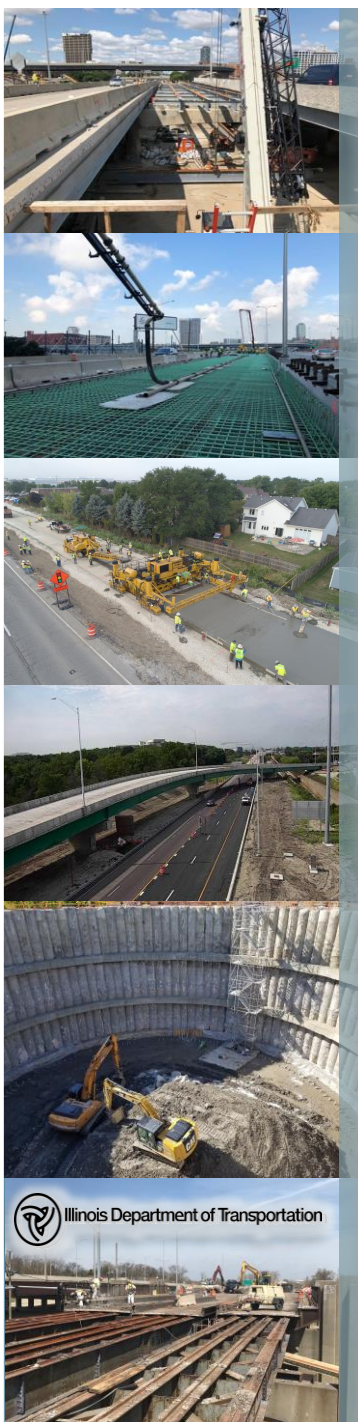


Due to the pandemic, **vehicle miles traveled in Illinois dropped by 13%** in 2020.

The decrease in motor fuel tax revenues was largely offset by federal COVID-19 relief, **preserving projects in the MYP.**



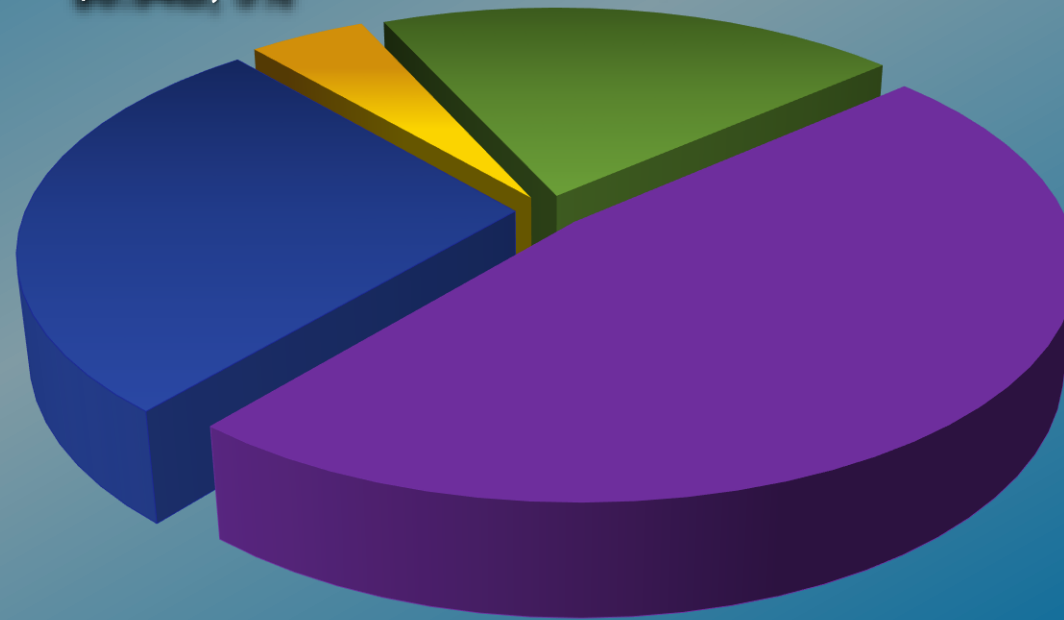
Statewide FY 2022-2027 Proposed Highway Improvement Program Fund Sources of \$20.70 billion

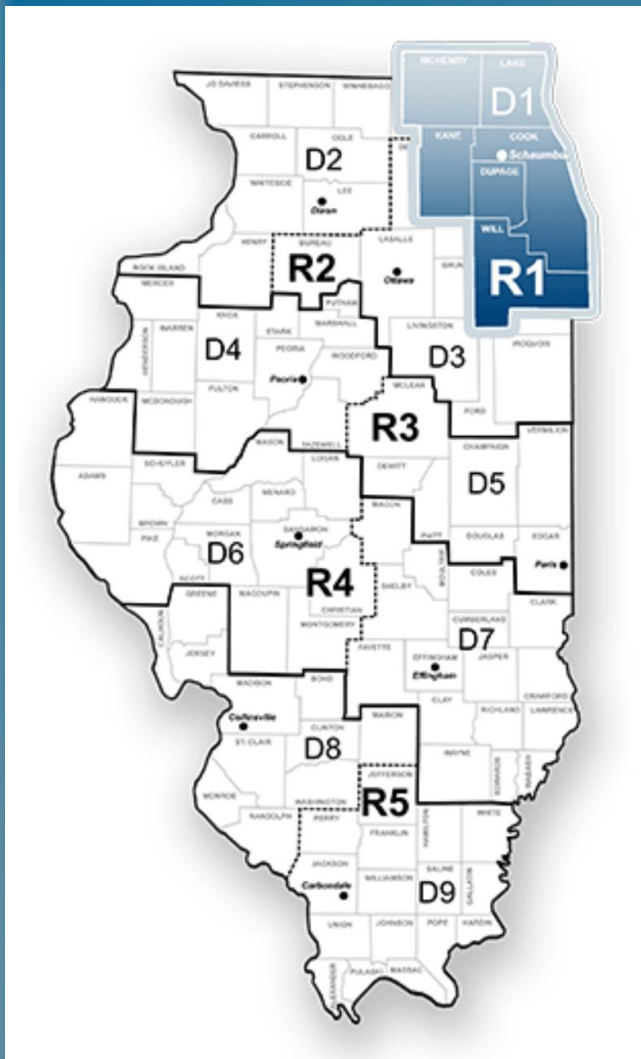

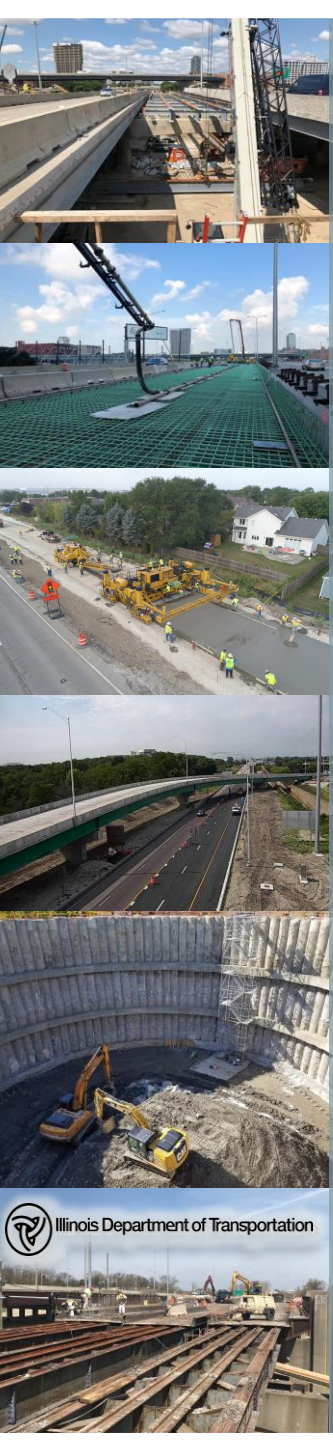

ESTIMATED STATE IMPACT ON TRANSPORTATION

Illinois is estimated to receive about **\$17.8B** in combined infrastructure funding over five years for all modes of transportation.



The act is focused on climate and equity to provide a safe, equitable, resilient and multimodal transportation system.



ESTIMATED STATE IMPACT ON ROADS & BRIDGES

Over five years, Illinois would expect to receive



\$11.2B (estimated) for highway development



\$1.4B (estimated) of the **\$11.2B** is for bridge replacement and repairs

Illinois can compete for



\$12.5B from the Bridge Investment Program for economically significant bridges



\$16B in funding for major projects that will deliver substantial economic benefits



PASSENGER RAIL



\$66B invested nationwide for Amtrak repairs, station improvement and train modernization



Will help bring passenger service to new cities and towns across the U.S.

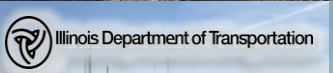

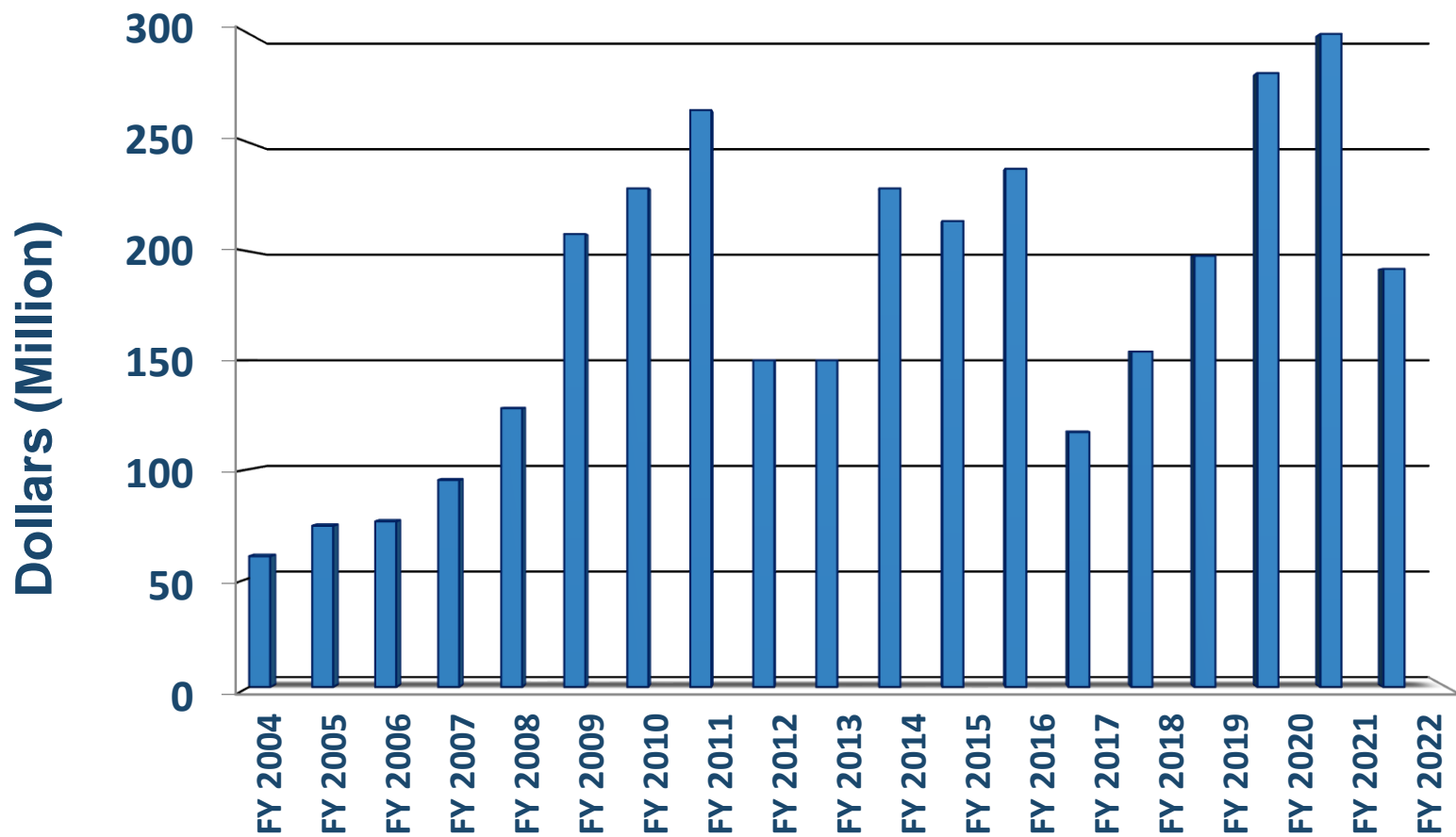
Statewide FY 2022-2027 Proposed Highway Improvement Program Fund Sources of \$20.70 billion



District One Historic Staffing Levels



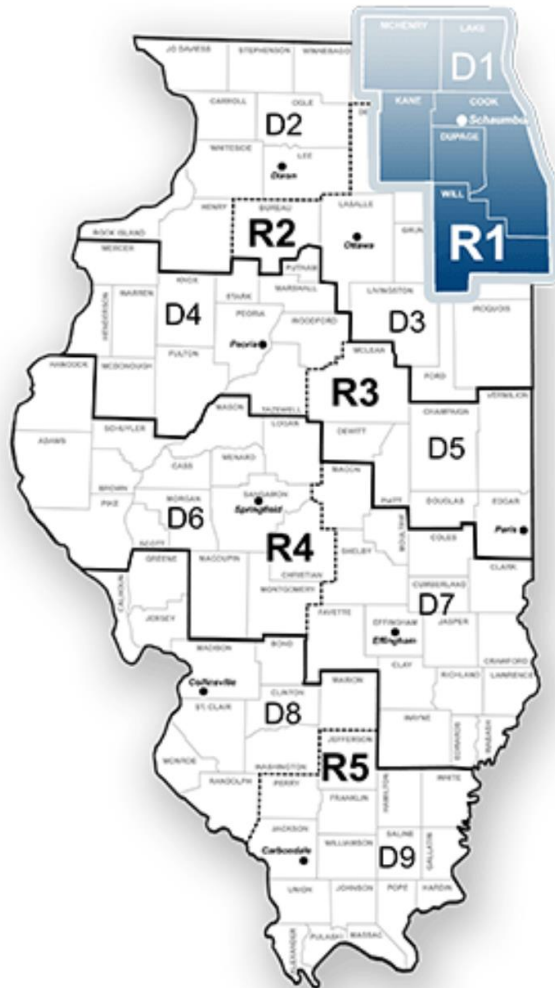
Engineering Funding Levels
