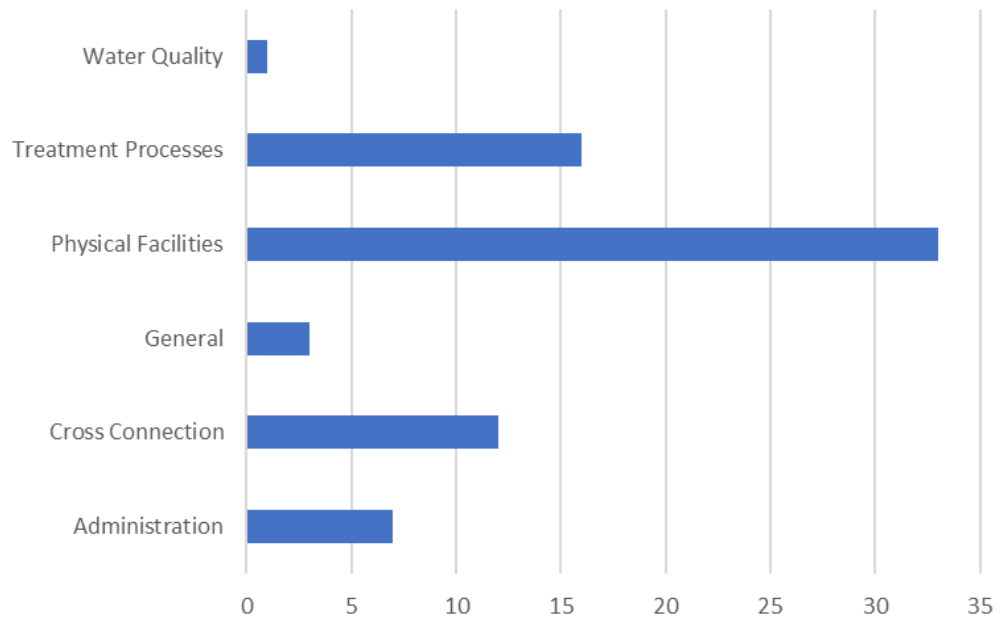

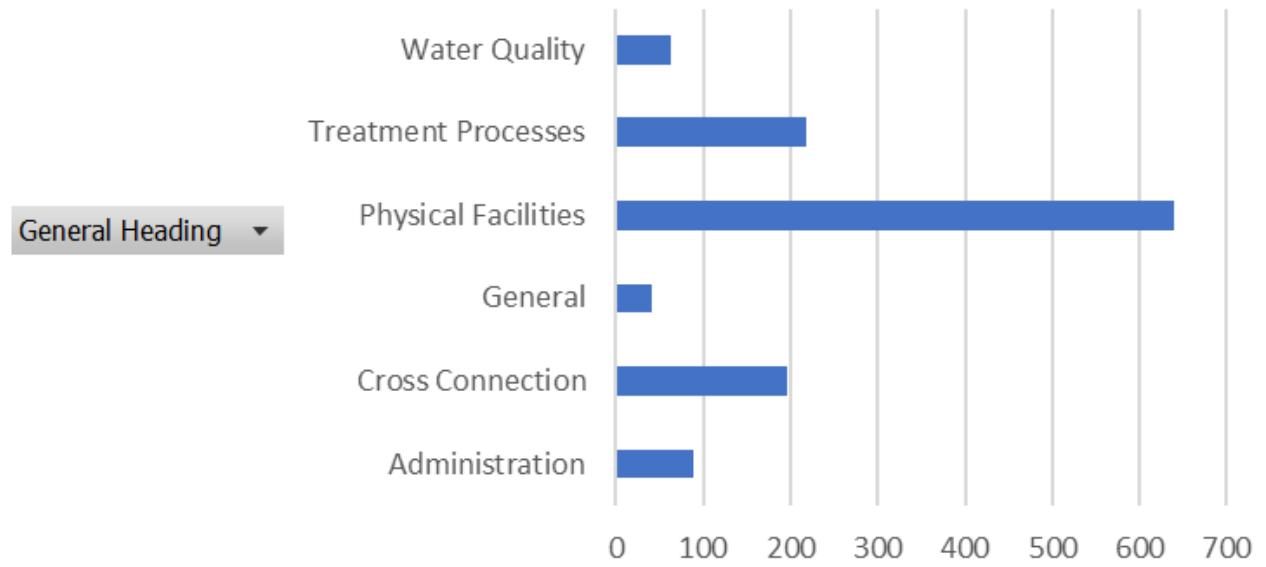

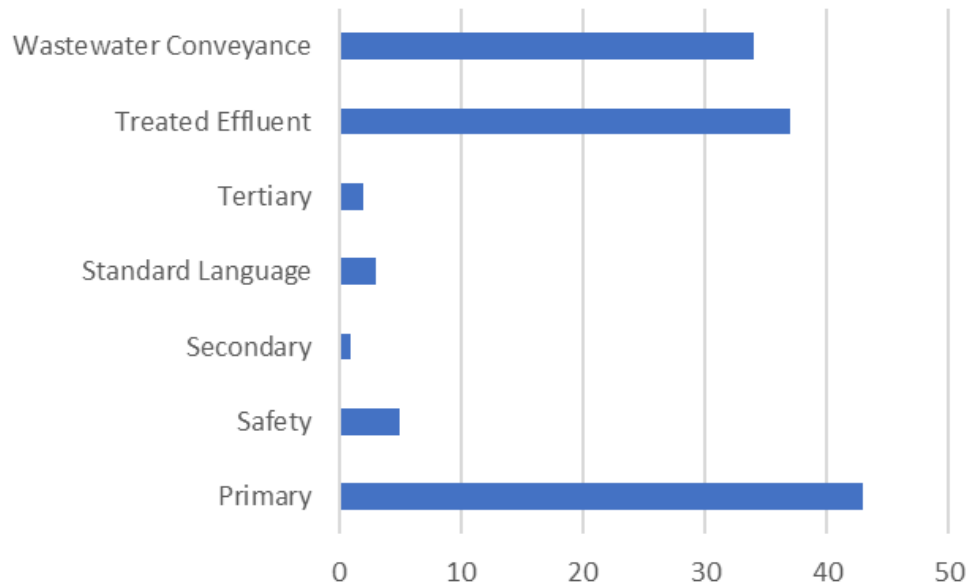

Midwest Region versus National Common Wastewater Deficiencies FY2023

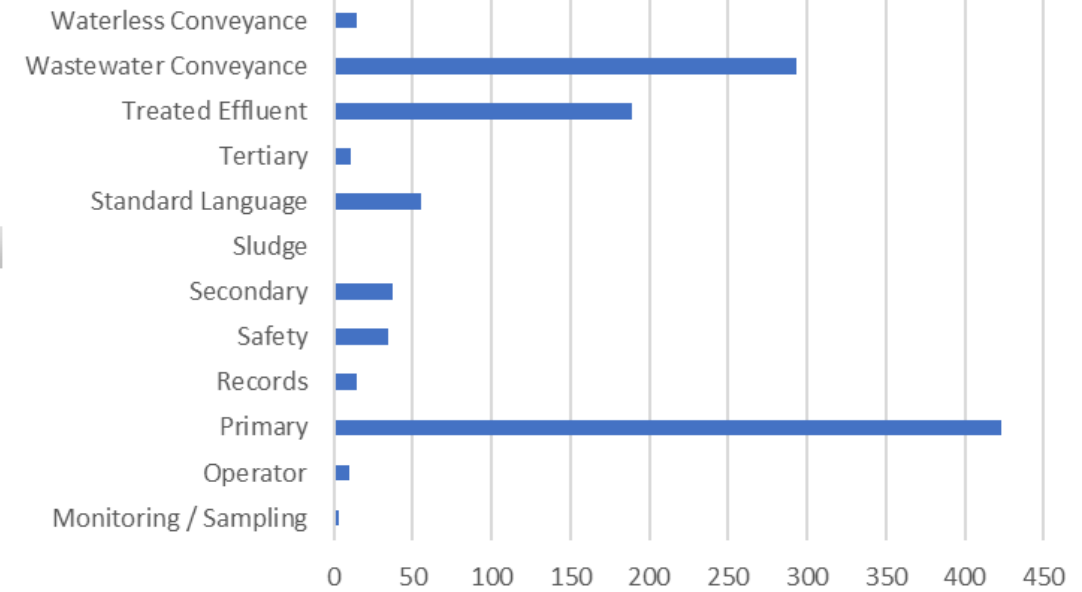
Count of Deficiency System Type

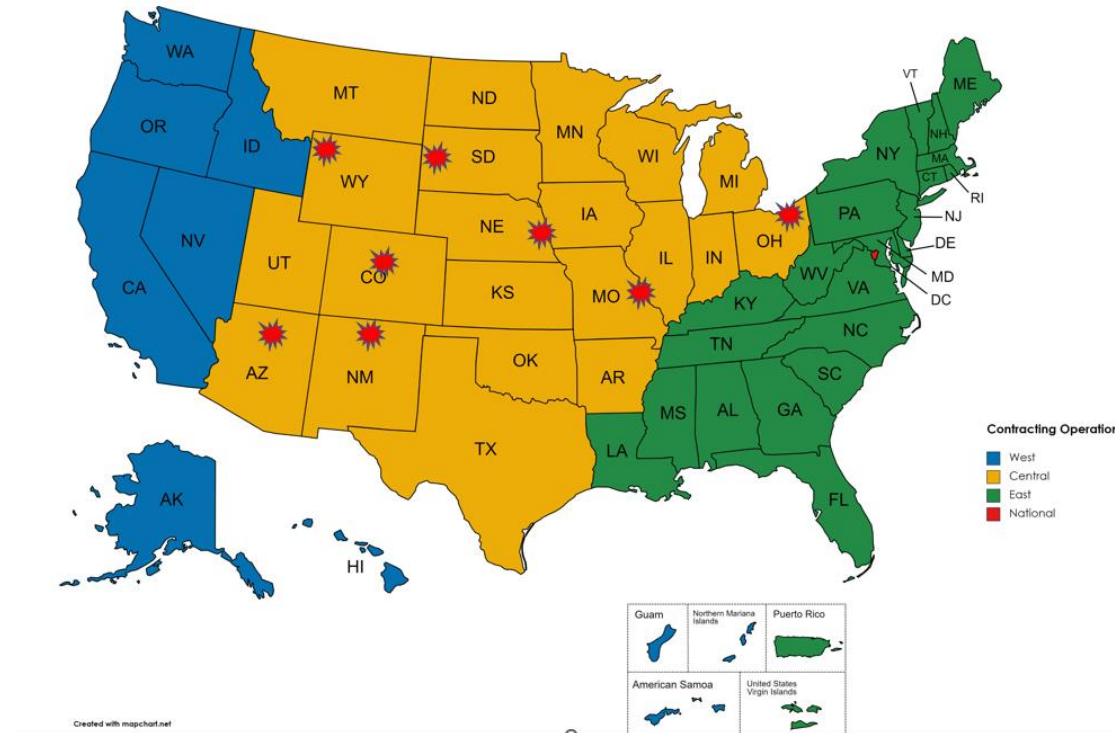

Contracting Small Business Focus

- NPS Contracting reorganized into East/Central/West teams with multiple buying offices
- FY23 -- \$195 Million with 3195 Contract Actions (Midwest and Intermountain Regions of Park Service)
- 20% Construction with 80% Services and Supplies
- Majority of spending between March and September each year
- Majority of purchases go to Small Business (86%)

NPS Contracting Operations Central



~ 21 States, 140+ park sites including Yellowstone, Grand Canyon, Glacier, Badlands, Hot Springs, Cuyahoga, Mount Rushmore, and many more

What do we purchase?

- Supplies: Grounds Equipment, Gravel, Building materials, ATVs/UTVs, Trailers, Propane, Vehicle fuel, Vault Toilets, Radio equipment
- Services: Aerial Spraying, Demolition, Elevator Maintenance, Waste Collection, Exhibit Reconditioning, HVAC Equipment Repairs, Tree Trimming, Landscaping
- Construction: Concrete sidewalks, Asphalt repairs, New facility expansions/remodels, Roofing, Sewers, Fencing, Culvert replacements,

Small Business Socio-Economic Considerations

- Most actions are less the \$250,000 and are automatically reserved for small business
- Projects over \$250,000 are screened with focus on HUBZone, Service-Disabled Veteran Owned, Woman Owned or 8(a) before small business
- Department of Interior authority for Indian Small Business Economic Enterprise setasides
- Small Business Specialists and SBA Procurement Center Representatives review market research to ensure small businesses are afforded contract opportunities
- SAM.gov is used to advertise contracting opportunities (focus on small businesses participation)
