Local Emergency Operations System

Carries overall responsibility for EOC operations. Sets and manages EOC operations toward fulfillment of incident support objectives



Coordinates communication among agency and jurisdictional public information officers and manages media relations JIC (Agency PIOs) EOC Public Information Officer

EOC Operations Specialist

Coordinates technical support and EOC access

Works with agency and organizational representatives to continuously monitor, evaluate, and disseminate information for purposes of maintaining situational awareness and a common operating picture.



This tornado developed at Omaha's Eppley Airfield and moved northeast to just east of Crescent, IA before dissipated just north of the Harrison-Pottawattamie County line.
